Course Description -- In this course we will study 17th and 18th century European philosophy. The philosophical problems dealt with during this time, the way they were conceived and answered, still have a profound impact on all philosophers today. We will discuss the central views of two whose lasting importance is beyond dispute: René Descartes and David Hume. We will focus on their metaphysical and epistemological views. Metaphysics concerns the nature of reality, e.g., the existence and nature the material world, living things and of God. Epistemological questions concern the possibility, nature and extent of our knowledge of the world. We will evaluate their solutions to the problems they set out to solve.
